RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE HOMEOWNER



Edge around all sprinkler heads to prevent grass from interfering with their operation.



Maintain all landscape plants to ensure they do not interfere with the operation of the irrigation system.



Properly fertilize and maintain lawns in a healthy condition, free of insects, disease, and weeds.

Sprinkler heads that don't rotate or push their heads above the landscape can't do their job effectively.

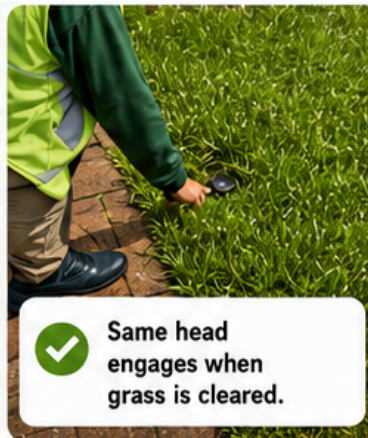


ROTOR

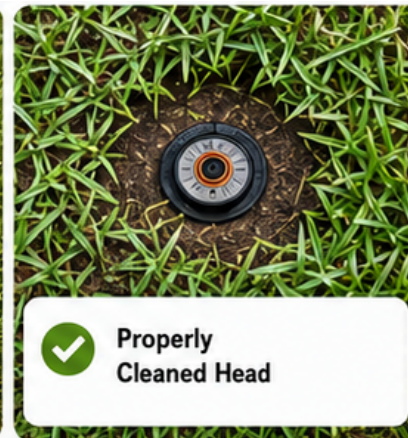
Heads that rotate typically located in back yards or larger areas.
