The golf course will be closed the Tuesday after Memorial Day. The target system needs to be replaced, currently working on that. The committee will table the golf round and rates discussion for another meeting. Added an August meeting.

Adopt-A-Hole: Lori Vivian will take over.

Communications: Tim will try to increase communications, but he is a working superintendent and is short-staffed currently. Tim will come up with more content for newsletters, FB, Instagram etc. Possibly working with another member of the committee on this.

Golf course rate proposal and Rounds played report-Bob: Bobs report reflects 590 members and 50 nonresident members. As of 05.24.23, there has been no increase in rates over the previous year. The committee recommends a 1.5% increase for residents and a 10% increase for non-resident singles and a 15% increase for non-resident couples. Resulting in a 1.845-million-dollar budget. There was an 18 % increase in rounds played from last year. There is a maximum of 55,000 to 59,000 rounds to be played on the course. Tim says the course is doing well with current play as long as we keep the Monday closures.

Communications: Matthew will give updates and recap for upcoming communications.

Utility boxes removal update: Bruce Johnson removed 10 boxes. He will continue to remove more of them.

Bulkhead on #17 update: the cart path will be removed by Tim and his crew. Bulkhead will be level with the new shell cart path. There is some concern about the bulkhead being tall enough due to the bid stating that the wall will start at or below the water level. Bruce Johnson will get with J.B. and Tim to verify.

Pro Shop report-Bruce H: Currently getting pricing for new targets to be installed. As far as we have found only one company produces them and they are pricey. Will try to find another company that produces them to compare prices. Won't decide on that right away. Still researching. Establishing a "Handicap committee" can educate golfers on rules and policies. The committee will be assisted by "Golf Hits" which is an automated software for handicap committees. It will track who posts their scores. The software is 900.00 dollars a year.

New Tee Markers: tee markers ordered they are 6 to 8 weeks out.

Lake retention Wall (Bulkhead) on #17: Project will be started next year we are waiting for permitting.

Ranger Proposal: Send it to the board if approved by committee. We need to bring more awareness to pace of play. Need to review current policies and compare and then make appropriate changes before submitting to the board. Bruce makes a motion to approve the ranger policy. Unanimously approved.

I. **CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL** – Chair Bruce Johnson

II. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** from 08/24/2023 - Minutes were presented from the August 24th, 2023 meeting. The minutes passed unanimously.

III. GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE REPORT – Tim Kortanek- Golf Course Superintendent

- New tee markers and flag sticks have arrived.
- Tim discussed golf course conditions, including height of cuts, and drainage with a focus on the front 9.
- Pine straw and new annual flowers will be installed around Thanksgiving.
- Monday p.m. closures will start in October. Adding more curbing around the course during some of the closures is planned. The Monday before the member guest will be open all day for practice rounds.
- A "Superintendent's Revenge" golf tournament was discussed. Tim will talk with Bruce Harris and work with the Committee regarding some type of tournament.
- The committee asked Tim to create a flower bed behind the number 14 tee.
- The post-Ian tree plantings are nearly in and should be established by November 1 so the tree supports can be removed. Jon Edinger asked him to look at the tree plan to make sure each area has been addressed. There was a question that some trees were still missing from the post-Ian plan.
- Irrigation improvements from the Golf Course Renovation have improved his efficiency. The committee reported there are missing irrigation box covers which are liability issues that needed to be addressed.

IV. GOLF SHOP REPORT – Bruce Harris Golf Professional

- The Monday afternoon closing scheduled. The Tuesday and Wednesday men's and ladies' day shotguns will begin in the morning with open play available in the 1 o'clock shotgun beginning October 9th. On Tuesdays following the shotgun, the driving range will be closed until 10:15 AM for maintenance.
- 55,000 rounds of golf have been played this fiscal year.
- The handicap committee will be formed later this month to monitor posting of scores. There will be five handicap committee members. According to Jon Edinger's experience, the new Cap Patrol handicap evaluation system that will be implemented at HG has worked well at his club once the members get accustomed to it.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- Lake Retention Wall on #17 Update Tim Kortanek was asked to report on the status of the #17 bulkhead. Tim reported that there's still a question of whether we need permitting or not. The engineering cost projections are approx. \$16,000. He's working with Artistic Structures and the County to determine whether the lake management plan is enough to avoid county permitting.
- Utility Box Removal Bruce Johnson reported that he has taken out 50 utility boxes around the golf course. Out-of-bounds left on number 10 will be determined at a future date.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

• FSGA Interclub Play – Email from John Trimble The committee discussed golf member, John Trimble's letter inquiring whether or not the club would be interested in participating in and hosting the Florida State Golf Association interclub competition. The interclub is a match-play event for men and women that play on Thursdays afternoons. Twice a month (one for men & one for women) 4 tee times would be set aside on Thursday afternoons for 8 HG members and 8 nonmembers (16 players). Nonmembers would be charged \$30 during peak season which would be less than what the normal rack rate would bring in. concerns were voiced that the low rate would preclude the club from maximizing afternoon revenue. The projected opportunity cost would be approx. \$4k in potential lost revenue due to the low price. However, the competition could showcase the golf course resulting in future revenue and PR. It was determined that the Herons Glen policy would allow a competition to be played on non-association days. The committee <u>voted</u> to support participating in the FSGA interclub and will make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors at its next meeting.

- I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL Chair Bruce Johnson
- II. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES-** Minutes were presented from the October 2, 2023 meeting. The minutes passed unanimously.
- III. GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE REPORT Tim Kortanek- Golf Course Superintendent
 - Wall-to-wall fertilizer will be applied in the coming week. The conversion of current pine straw areas to shell are in process including #9. Drainage behind #8 tee was discussed and will be addressed.
 - Regarding #17 bulkhead, the engineering firm has begun work on the permitting, but no timeline has been established to begin work. The plan is to make #17 either a par 3 or par 4. (Scores can still be posted per USGA guidelines) A recommendation by management will be brought before the committee prior to commencing work.
 - The committee asked about rumble strips around the curves on the cart paths. Tim said he would like to avoid those but will address the worn areas around the cart path curves. He plans on phasing in concrete or shell to prevent turf damage in these areas. He will compile a list of cart path improvements, develop a plan, and assign budget numbers to the plan.
 - Tim is proposing a 2-week closure after July 4th instead of the normal three 1-week closures throughout the summer. He would like to address the encroachment of the Bimini onto the TIF Eagle greens which has become more prevalent but typical for SW Fla. golf courses with this type of Bermuda combination.
 - The Portofino pump house motors are now repaired and will be able to provide fresh water on the front and back nines in the event we can't receive effluent water for irrigation.
 - Cart path repairs and widening around many of the Par 3 tees is scheduled this summer.
 - The committee asked GM, J.B. Belknap to investigate the steep bump in the cart path repair along Palo Duro leading to #9 tee.

IV. GOLF SHOP REPORT – Bruce Harris Golf Professional

- Bruce discussed the progress of the handicap committee and CAP patrol along with training the Rangers related to pace of play and dress code. Discussion centered around acceptable pace of play. Bruce is aware of the issues and plans to increase the number of Rangers during the season to address concerns.
- Summer golf rounds were up due to the lack of rain and corresponding surplus on the tee sheet. Revenue has been robust this year but the increase in rounds remains a concern due to turf wear and tear.
- Placing the 150-yard markers on the cart path on the par fours and fives was discussed. Bruce will implement.
- The number of feet or yards that players should stay from away from the greens was debated. The committee also expressed their concern about 3 carts in a group and urged Bruce to have players double up so that only 2 carts are in each grouping.
- Bruce discussed the public green fee rates and having the flexibility in season to raise the rates as needed. He is considering a variety of variables including the surplus and capacity for tee times along with competitor pricing to determine the rates. The 10-play pass for resident nonmembers, as well as the high RNM green fees, was discussed. The committee agreed that Green Fees for resident non-members are too high because a portion of their yearly bond payment is allocated to the purchase and renovation of the golf course.
- The committee made a <u>motion</u> to recommend the Board of Supervisors reestablish the 10-play pass starting in January for resident nonmembers. The <u>motion</u> was accepted by the committee. The motion was then amended to state that the 10-play pass should be sold for the price of 9 rounds with the 10th round being free. Limit one time purchase per household. The **motion passed**.
- V. **NEXT MEETING**: The next meeting is scheduled for January 8th at 1 PM.
- VI. **ADJOURNMENT** Adjourn 10:15 AM
